# LOCKTENDER'S HOUSE AND HERITAGE CENTER MUSEUM TOURS by Doneta Merkle

The Locktender's House and the Heritage Center Museum will be open for tours from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM on Sundays May 25, June 22, July 20, August 17, and September 21. Both venues will also be open during the Walnutport Canal Days festival on Saturday, October 18 and Sunday, October 19. Admission for the Locktender's House is \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for children. Admission for the Heritage Center Museum is \$1.00 per person. Plan to visit both sites on one of these dates. You'll learn the history of the Lockhouse and the Frank Kelchner family at the Locktender's House and the museum presents the history and life in Walnutport and surrounding areas, as well as the Walnutport section of the Lehigh Canal, dating back to 1740. We have an urgent need for additional tour guides for both locations; but more so for the Locktender's House. Three guides are needed for both locations. Tour information is provided to Lockhouse tour guides to conduct the tour and there is a printed self-guided tour booklet to give to museum visitors. ### **Update on Environmental Improvements on the Canal**

As spring approaches you may start to see flowers, shrubs and trees along the canal and beside the boat launch that weren't there before. These new plants are the result of a 2023 grant from Lehigh Valley Greenways to the Watershed Coalition of the Lehigh Valley (WCLV) to remove an invasive plant, Japanese Knotweed, that was affecting native plants and lowering animal life in and beside the canal. Last year at this time plans were made to provide a spring vision of graceful Redbud Trees and budding Pussy Willows and a multitude of wildflowers in bloom in place of the Knotweed infested areas that were growing exponentially every year along the canal and river.

The Bertsch Hockendauqua Catasauqua Watershed Association, our local volunteer Watershed group and, a member of the WCLV, enlisted volunteers from the Walnutport Canal Association and the community to remove the Knotweed and plant four hundred fifty Wildflower plugs and seventy native shrubs and trees in four areas along the canal and beside the boat launch. A sign is planned for installation this fall in the boat launch area to explain what work was done and why invasive plants harm the balance of nature. As time passes we will start to see these plants grow and fill in the reclaimed areas, to stabilize the waterway banks and restore animal and plant diversity along the canal.

Invasive plants generally crowd out native plants that feed and provide shelter to local wildlife - birds, insects and other pollinators as well as reptiles, fish and amphibians. Over time they will completely take over an area crowding out local vegetation. The Japanese Knotweed removal is a difficult process as it grows by spreading roots that must all be removed to stop the spread of this invasive plant. Yearly maintenance will be required to catch any regrowing Knotweed, but as time passes, this need will decrease. Since we had such a dry fall we may need to replace some plants that didn't receive sufficient water to live through the winter. We welcome volunteers that can help with plant replacement and other tasks to maintain our environmental improvements to our beautiful Walnutport Canal Park. We are beginning to work on the final wall in the main museum showroom. In this section, to be titled "Community", it is our hope to display a variety of pictures and memorabilia of schools, churches, our fire company and a few other surprises that we hope you will enjoy. We already have some police department items on display. It's also our objective to add another display case so we can exhibit items that cannot be hung on the wall.

For the past year or so it has become apparent to us that we will soon run out of space to display pictures, artifacts and other items that we either already have or that may be donated to us in the future. Problem solved! I'm happy to share with you that we've expanded our museum this past fall. Our talented association craftsman, Vince Morris, graciously converted his "workshop" into an additional showroom. Located just beyond the general store, the floor has been painted, and rough-cut pine was put on the walls. We are so grateful for this additional space where we will house the newly acquired twenty-two foot 1/4 scale replica of a canal boat mentioned in the President's article below.

In closing, I'd like to report that our newly opened media room was well received during both last year's summer open house tours and the Walnutport Canal Days festival. What a fantastic addition this has been in that it helps broaden the museum visit experience. Please stop and check it out when our museum is open this year. 
